Geography and Climate Location: Borders Ukraine, Moldova, Bulgaria, Serbia, and Hungary, with a Black Sea coast. Landscape: Dominated by the Carpathian Mountains, which cross the center, and the Danube River which forms the delta in the southeast. Climate: Temperate-continental with four distinct seasons. Size: 238,397 , making it the 12th largest country in Europe.

Modern Day: A developing economy that joined NATO in 2004 and

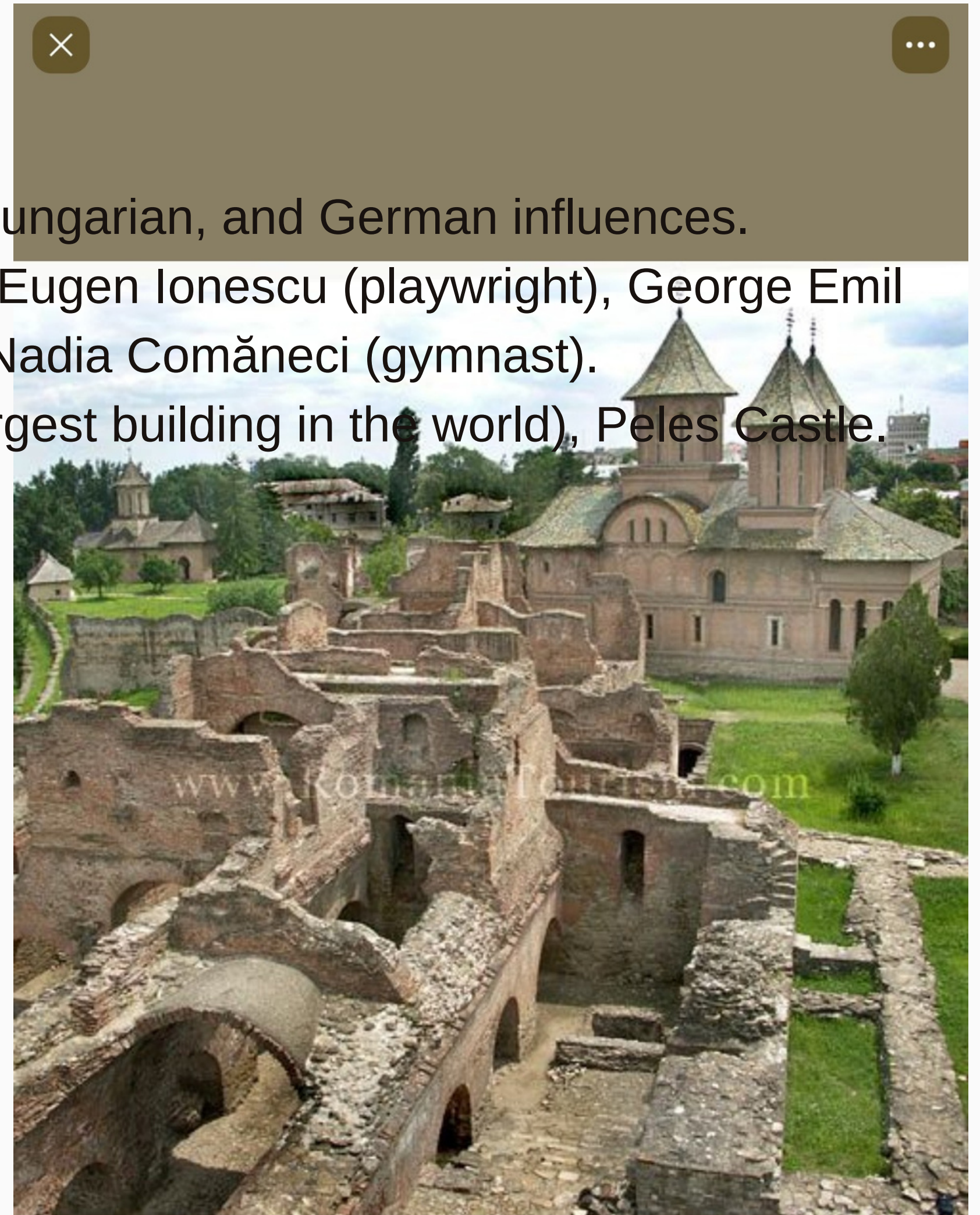


Culture
